Two large cirques and one small one contributed ice to this glacier, which had a total area of GJ square miles. The head of this system took its ice from the slopes of Mount Evans and Dyer Mountain. This cirque is large and broadly Ushaped and is cut down into the pre-Cambrian gneiss. At its upper end the east wall of this valley rises in an almost perpendicular cliff below Dyer Mountain.
